

**God's Amazing Crazy Plan for You**  
Part 2 of 3  
**WHAT R U DOING HERE?**

Could it be that, wherever you are, you are right in the middle of God's will for your life — and maybe, just maybe, whatever is happening in your life is not just for you, but involves what God wants to do through you for the sake of others? In the book of Esther, Mordecai, a prominent Jew, says it this way to a young Jewish woman, probably a teenager, in the harem of a Middle Eastern king: "And who knows but that you have come to royal position **for such a time as this?**"

In Esther 4, , we discover six important lessons about living your life for God and others:

1. **Do everything you can. Leave everything else for God. Esther 4:6-8.**
2. **So, what are you doing here? Everything in your life ultimately has something to do with God's purposes \_\_\_\_\_.** Esther 4:9-11

Christians love to ask, "What's God's purpose for my life?" Wrong question. The correct question is: "What is God's purpose for others through me."

**IT'S NOT ABOUT YOU.** — Rick Warren
